

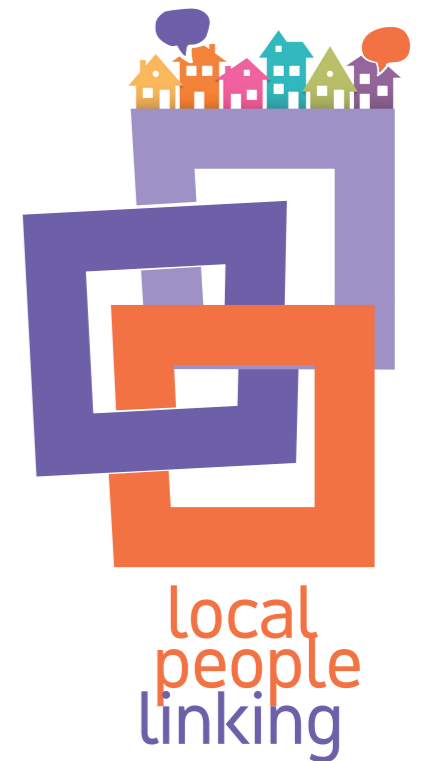
Local People Linking creates the space for older people to come together to learn about their rights in an everyday context, to shape their local communities and the services in them, so they can exercise their rights for a better life.

This resource shares the learning of what rights are important to the communities we work with and the difference it makes when people can access their rights.

“We’re all in this together- rights are about respecting each other, helping each other out and showing each other kindness- no matter what.”

Creating an inclusive digital community became our new reality in early 2020. Taking part in online spaces has become part of how we exercise our human rights in our daily lives. Even though we couldn’t meet with older people in their communities, we were able to create new digital spaces as part of our learning about rights sessions, to bring people together and hear about what rights are important to them in an everyday context.

Being accepted into a group for the first time, helped save my life.

Being able to travel independently- I have freedom to pick a destination and go without having to ask for help.

Support in hospital, helped me get back into art which I'm still doing.

I didn't have digital equipment before I joined my group- last week I gave a speech to 40 university students using my new skills!

Getting the chance to meet new people and try new things- new digital equipment has supported me to get a Level 4 SQA in Computing.

I always struggled with education but when I re-engaged as an adult, I found out I am dyslexic- it changed everything- now I realise my whole life what the issue was and now I have a 1st class honours degree.
