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Food

- Re-usable mugs - encourage & build up stock
- Work with community food groups - local & options
- More food!
- Prioritising access

Travel

- Incentives - travel tickets
- 'Travel fund' - pre-paid/flexible
- Time banks
- Buildings - accessible to transport hubs

Resources

- Re-use & recycle
- Need for incentives? No more bottles!

Challenges

- Engaging people over Teams
- Not everyone uses the internet
- Cycling to work - may have to use shower
- Cost of parking
- Cost of trains

Travel

- Car share/ taxi share
- Online meetings
- Ask people how they travel
- new stations make things more accessible

Food

- Supporting local businesses
- Reusable bags
- Plastic packaging

Buildings

- Old buildings are hard to insulate - but this can be very expensive

Climate impact of AI use

EV salary sacrifice schemes

Understanding impact of digital carbon footprint

To help make them more resilient to future extreme weather events

4 day work week!

Climate/ carbon baseline surveys for employees to gather data on commutes & travel

Carbon literacy training - make individual pledges to take action to reduce carbon

Encourage walking to reduce car use in schools & businesses

Working with Dynamic Earth to create easy-read info about climate change

Capacity - time, staff

Organisational transitions away from banks/ investments & pensions in fossil fuels

Audit on listed building - some buy-in issues though was okay to do

Migration - over Ukraine, Gaza

Climate audit

- Wormery is a good idea ties in with growing projects
- Heating & energy - is it in the audit? why not?
- Travel & transport
 - use a cargo bike
 - difficult in rural context
 - big issue in Scotland
 - carsharing/ liftshare
 - funding challenges.

Refreshments

- Avoiding individually wrapped refreshments
- Sharing recipes with a cost of living 'hook'
- Publicising food-sharing apps like Olio
- Examining own practices, not just doing good work with communities
- 'Practice what you preach'
- Veggie catering policy, encouraging people to bring own cups

Travel & transport

- Paths for All promote walking & wheeling/ active travel routes
- Thinking about how to embed behaviour change without the infrastructure in place or accessibility (where car is only option)
- Car sharing as organisations
- Within expenses policy (inc. volunteers) ensure cycle expenses policy
- Provide accessible travel routes (as SCVO did)

Resources

- Took on community garden but resources used where over-packaged
- Led to questioning about process

Overall

- Need to start with 'easy wins'
- More formal process to audit own organisation's actions
- Consider what's within immediate control & where do you have influence with other people/orgs

- Creating partnerships: Amplify work, Connect groups, Local projects
- Community gardens
- Managing issues local, real & personal to communities
- Removing barriers & increasing participation for those with disabilities
- Encouraging collaboration
- Online forums - issues - build awareness
- Connecting social with climate action
